


DR. ELMAR JOURA



Dr. Elmar Armin Joura is a distinguished Austrian gynecologist and obstetrician with a remarkable career in the field of women's health. Dr. Joura's professional journey is marked by a commitment to clinical excellence, research, and education. His educational path began at the University of Graz Medical School, where he laid the foundation for his medical expertise during the years 1980-1987. Following this, he joined the Department of Pathology at the University of Graz, Austria, in 1988.

Over the years, Dr. Joura has held key positions in numerous international organizations and has been actively involved in clinical trials, particularly in the field of HPV vaccines. Dr. Joura's career is a testament to his dedication to advancing women's health and his unwavering commitment to education, research, and clinical excellence. He has served as the President of EUROGIN 2016 congress and as the President of the European College for the Study of Vulvovaginal Disease (ECSVD) from 2018 to 2020, further solidifying his influence and leadership in the field.

DR. JACK SOBEL



Jack D Sobel, MD, is a Distinguished Professor of Medicine and the Dean of the Wayne State University School of Medicine in Detroit, Michigan. Dr Sobel received his medical degree from the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa. He is a board-certified internal medicine specialist in the United States, the United Kingdom, Israel, and South Africa. He is a board-certified infectious disease specialist in the United States. He is a world-renowned expert in urogynecological infections of the female genital tract. His treatments are the standard of care throughout the world and millions of women have benefited from his innovative therapeutic regimens. He is the author of more than 500 peer-reviewed scholarly articles, has written seven books, and has contributed to many medical texts.

DR. OLUSHOLA AKINSHEMOYIN VAUGHN



Olushola Akinshemoyin Vaughn, MD (Shola Vaughn) is an Assistant Professor of Dermatology at the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) and Section Chief of Dermatology at the Zablocki Veterans' Hospital. Originally from Milwaukee, she graduated from Harvard University and moved to Los Angeles to play in bands before returning to medical school at the University of Wisconsin - School of Medicine and Public Health. She completed residency at MCW before joining the faculty. Her interests include vulvar dermatoses in skin of color, transgender skin concerns, and global health. She is the Director of Froedtert's Mucosal Skin Specialty Clinic for oral and anogenital skin disorders. She is also the dermatologist for Froedtert's Inclusion Health Clinic, the medical home for Milwaukee's LGBTQ population. She has completed two medical mission trips to Vietnam, in collaboration with Health Volunteers Overseas and Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

DR. HEATHER MILLAR



Heather Millar, MD, MIPH, FRCSC, is an ObGyn with a focus on Family Planning and Global Women's Health and Equity at Women's College and Mount Sinai Hospitals as well as a Paediatric and Adolescent Gynaecologist at SickKids Hospital. She completed her residency in ObGyn and subsequent fellowships in Global Women's Health and Equity (GWHE) and Paediatric and Adolescent Gynaecology (PAG) at the University of Toronto.

During Heather's fellowship training, she became interested in the impact of trauma on care experiences and health outcomes within marginalized populations. Her PAG fellowship research focused on Trauma-Informed Care (TIC) for pregnant and parenting adolescents. She has continued on to present and teach locally, nationally and internationally on TIC in ObGyn, is a member of the TIC Working Group at SickKids Hospital and is leading SOGC guideline development on TIC in ObGyn.

DR. JORDAN LEWIS



Jordan Lewis is a fourth year Obstetrics and Gynecology resident at the University of British Columbia. She obtained her medical degree from the University of Toronto prior to returning to her home of Vancouver, BC. She continues to apply her background in quality improvement and medical innovation on active research projects, including a local quality improvement initiative on cervical cancer risk reduction with adjuvant HPV vaccination at time of colposcopy. She looks forward to continuing to learn and collaborate with multidisciplinary members of the colposcopy community to improve our surveillance and management of lower genital tract malignancies.

Dr. Zigras is a Gynecologic Oncologist at Trillium Health Partners, Credit Valley Hospital. She completed her OB/GYN training at Yale New Haven Health, Bridgeport Hospital, Connecticut, USA. She has an interest in surgical education, cancer prevention, HPV infections and cancers of the lower genital tract.

Following her doctorate, she graduated from Harvard Medical School and then completed her residency in Obstetrics and Gynaecology with a specialization in Addiction Medicine at the University of Toronto.
